Table Top presentations - Call for Abstracts

The pre conference seminar day is offering an interactive session where a number of presenters will be able to share their innovative work in a table top format. During this session, delegates will be seated at round tables of 10 with one presenter per table. Hence there will be several presenters for this session.

Presentations will be 6 minutes long with the remainder of the time at each table used for discussion. Presenters will move to a new table every 10 minutes to allow delegates to hear from a number of different speakers and discuss a variety of issues.

Abstracts are called for and will be assessed against the following criteria:

1. An interesting/exciting approach to immunisation.
2. Outlines an element of immunisation provision using an innovative approach.
3. Indicates ability for broad application in a variety of situations.
4. A project/approach to immunisation based on evidence and evaluation.
5. Immunisation provision or program that is sustainable.
6. Immunisation as a shared process.

All intended presentations require the submission of an abstract. Abstract format requirements are:

- All abstracts must be submitted as a word document (windows compatible) attachment to an email to: hmoore@agpn.com.au
- The abstract must show the title of the abstract (12 words or less), name of the presenter and the presenter's contact details
- State the presenter's full name, title, email address, postal address, telephone and fax.
- The abstract should be a maximum of 200 words in simple text paragraphs without tables or sub-headings
- Presenters will be notified of acceptance by 19 July 2010
- **All presenters must register and pay the Seminar Day registration fee. General Practice Network officers should register on the special network registration form.**
