2011**

Annually a maximum of two awards will be made; one to an individual and one to a group/organisation which has contributed significantly to the advancement of public health in Western Australia.

The Award will comprise of a framed certificate signed by the WA Branch President and will be conferred with a citation at the Annual General Meeting.

**APPLICATION GUIDELINES**

1. Nominations must have two nominators.
2. Both nominators must be PHAA WA Branch members.
3. Nominators must include a brief justification for nominating the individual or organisation (Complete attached Nomination Form. 400 words maximum).
4. The following guidelines should be considered when nominating the individual or organisation:
  - The contribution should have the potential to improve the health of large numbers of particularly vulnerable groups of the population.
  - The contribution may be in any field of public health, including but not limited to: delivery of health services; planning and administration of health services; health research and health promotion.
  - The contribution required effort and commitment beyond the call of duty.
  - Contributions made over an extended period will be considered favourably.
  - Voluntary work and committee membership will be considered favourably.
  - Nominations should not be limited to leaders of health professionals, communities or organisations, but should recognise contributions at all levels including volunteers and community members.
5. Nominations close at **COB Monday 3 October 2011**. Late applications will not be accepted. Nominations should be forwarded to Prof Peter Howat, Chair PHAA Awards Committee
