Dr Helen Caldicott



Dr Caldicott is a passionate environmental advocate, internationally known as a campaigner on nuclear issues, co-founder of Physicians For Social Responsibility and President of the Nuclear Policy Research Institute in Washington DC.

Dr Caldicott was born in Melbourne and graduated from the University of Adelaide with a medical degree. She went on to work as a paediatrician but became increasingly concerned about the dangers of the nuclear age and eventually resigned her medical practice in order to focus on advocacy.

She has received numerous international and national awards, including a nomination for the Nobel Peace Prize. She holds 19 honorary doctorates and has been named as one of the most influential women of the 20th century. She has authored seven books and is the subject of a number of films and television documentaries.
