



THE NSW HEALTH & EQUITY STATEMENT TEN YEARS ON: Where to next?



Ten years ago the NSW Health and Equity Statement was developed in a climate that was focused on moving from describing health inequalities to taking action on health inequalities and to improve health equity overall.

A decade later there have been significant developments (globally, regionally and nationally) including more specific articulation of equity objectives, the final report of the WHO global Commission on Social Determinants of Health which advocates for action to tackle the social gradient in health and the development and implementation of a national strategy for health inequity.

In her presentation, Sarah will focus on developments in the field of action on equity, in particular more specific articulation of different equity objectives or outcomes of action on social determinants and health equity, how this has developed over the past 10 years, and interpretations of what it means to remedy health inequity.

Sarah currently works for the WHO Regional Office for Europe, and was a member of the Secretariat for the global Commission on the Social Determinants of Health.

Her talk however will be based on her personal reflections and as former member of the team that developed the NSW Health and Equity Statement, including what these developments mean for advancing a new version of the Health and Equity Statement and the role of the health system in putting its own house in order for improved health equity.

Sarah will be introduced by Fran Baum who was one of the Commissioners on the WHO Commission on the Social Determinants of Health.
